Traditional Waste Management in Barbados










Waste as a Resource

Waste Management and Elimination – Waste management Programmes

- o First determine what you have Waste Audit.
 - Types of waste
 - Practices leading to this waste
- Possible pushback
 - Persuading managers and co-workers to make changes in the workplace can be a challenge
 - Difficult to break habits
 - Perceived as time consuming and inconvenient

Why Eliminate Waste?

- Saves money
 - Benefit to the company
 - Reduces unnecessary purchase of items e.g. paper. Go paperless as far as possible
 - Less money spent on garbage removal if less garbage generated
- Reduces waste going to the landfill
 - National benefit
- Conserves natural resources
 - National, regional and International benefit

Results and Recommendations

- Once the Waste Audit is successfully conducted there needs to be an analysis of the results in order to make recommendations.
 - What items can be reduced –Can we make changes in purchasing that would result in a reduction in the amount of waste produced?
 - Eliminate unnecessary printing
 - Email information
 - Multipurpose cleaners
 - Water saving devices
 - Energy saving devices
 - Turn off equipment at the end of the day

Results and Recommendations

- What items could be reused
 - Take your own cutlery and crockery to work and reuse these rather than getting disposables when purchasing lunch
 - Contract entities that reuse items rather than use single use, disposables items e.g. meetings and workshop lunches
- What items could be recycled
 - Is there a lot of paper and paper products that can be recycled even after trying to reduce paper waste
- What must be disposed of
 - Office garbage
 - Lunch room garbage
